A high level of professionalism, capacity to work autonomously, initiative and superior communication skills is required in this key role. Ideally the successful candidate would have experience in the building industry, engineering or project management.

ASSSEMBLY: PLENARY COUNCIL: Keep up with the latest Plenary news:

The Connection between the Plenary Council and the Synod of Bishops.

There has been some confusion amongst people about the Synod and the Plenary Council. In preparation for the 5th Plenary Council of Australia, we have been on a four-year journey of listening, dialogue and discerning what God is asking of us in Australia at this time.

Now Pope Francis is asking us to a similar thing, but together with the entire Church worldwide. As Christ's church, we are all called to living in a synodal way, attentive to others and ready to walk alongside one another. In your parishes you will have already experienced aspects of living synodally as a faith community. The synodal journey is not something which ends with the Synod of Bishops meeting in Rome

in 2023 but is meant to be the way in which we are to be disciples of Christ, bearing his Good News for the transformation of ourselves, the church and the world.

Dear Father, Deacon, Parish Leader,

Families are a vital part of parish and community life. We want to promote strong and flourishing families and relationships. As such, we cannot ignore the critical issue of domestic and family violence within our local communities, and the Gospel mandate that calls us to do something about this.

Following the release of the 2015 Victorian Royal Commission into Family Violence, which encourages faith communities to be proactive about addressing domestic violence, the Victorian Bishops wrote a pastoral statement as a part of a Domestic Violence Resource Kit, put together by Catholic Social Services Victoria (CSSV), for parishes. To further support the implementation of this resource, several parishes in Victoria engaged Sister Nicole Rotaru RSM (auspiced by Catholic Social Services Victoria) to equip themselves to deal with domestic violence. The workshops helped to deepen the participants' understanding of what domestic violence is, the various ways in which it is overtly and insidiously perpetrated and provided a closer examination of the impact that domestic violence has on women and children and how we can respond and work to prevent this. Recent research has sadly indicated that violence is used just as much within faith communities as it is in the general population.

I am pleased to inform you that Sr Nicole is hosting workshops within our own parish communities in the diocese over the coming weeks and months. This will make up a 'pilot' program of workshops and will develop the capacity for an effective whole-of-Church response to the prevention of violence against women, children, and men.

These workshops aim to:

- build awareness of the complexity, immediate and inter-generational impacts amongst faith leaders and influencers in the community,
- build awareness of the propensities that faith communities have to prevent and respond well to situations of violence, and also propensities that may dismiss, perpetuate and at worse allow domestic violence, and
- create connections within and across faith communities and local social services that allows for the pooling of resources and mutual support for activity that creates a community of care, respect, and love and which actively addresses the gendered drivers of violence.



In engaging in this pilot project, we hope that our diocese will become an example of how we can effectively and whole-heartedly work towards being in right relationship with each other — that all our relating to one another builds up the dignity of each person and promotes each one's flourishing — man, woman, and child.

I commend this project and give all involved my blessing. I pray that together we can work toward a community that is free from any form of violence against each other. We pray that our families can all be a place of safety, love and nurture, and flourishing.
