#### **ST VINCENT DE PAUL**:

During the month of September ST VINCENT DE PAUL Society is revitalising and promoting the society, highlighting the works we do.

Our core work involves visiting people, who contact the Society for assistance with living expenses. On these visits, always done in pairs, we offer material assistance as well as friendship and support, affirming the dignity of each person, regardless of their situation.

Last year, St Joseph's Conference assisted 1085 people providing \$31,255 in assistance, as well as supporting Baw Baw Food Relief which contributed enormously.

St Ita's Conference has assisted 733 people providing \$ 29,611.

On a broader level, our members and volunteers assist people each year across Australia. Worldwide, the Society has over 800,000 members and 1.5 million volunteers in over 150 countries assisting over 30 million people. Sounds amazing

however we are still in need of volunteers. There are many ways to support. If visiting is not something you are comfortable with: the organising of materials or answering and making phones calls is more your thing - there is a space for you. And with Christmas coming up quickly, our Christmas Gifting preparation will be starting. Many hands make light the work.

But just importantly, we are a spiritual organisation. Our members live out our faith in action, gathering at regular parish conference meetings not only to organise and report on the works we do, but also to pray, to reflect and to help one another in their faith journey.

This spirituality underpins all our works. Inspired by the examples of our Patron, St Vincent de Paul, and our founder, Blessed Fredric Ozanam, we endeavour to see the face of Christ in every person we assist.

## Give Us Mercy, Not Fairness

John Newton, slave ship captain turned anti-slavery reformer and writer of the hymn "Amazing Grace", well understood this Sunday's gospel passage (Mt 20:1-16). After an early life spent inflicting unspeakable horror on his brothers and sisters, he was transformed through God's grace.

Sometimes we get tangled up with the idea that goodness, compassion and church-going is so that God will love us and save us. That it is about us paying dues or doing our time. Oh dear! There is nothing we can do to make God love us more or less.

As Christians, we strive to love God and our neighbour because we know how graced we are by Him, not the other way round. Newton spent the remainder of his life amazed that God's grace could save even a wretch like him.

He understood that our Creator is just and generous. God's justice doesn't mean "anything goes" but it is divine justice tempered with vast divine mercy which reflects immeasurable love for each of us. God's Reign is overflowing with justice and generosity.

This gospel of the landowner paying all his workers the same generous pay, regardless of how many hours they have worked, offends notions of fairness. But, of course, the parable is about the generosity of God and we certainly don't want God giving us a fair go; rewarding us according to our merits. As sinners who fall way short of living our best, we are lost. If we got a fair go from God then we would stay lost. We couldn't earn salvation. None of us would be saved.

It is precisely because we don't get a fair go, but rather a merciful go from God, that we are saved.

# Gospel Matthew 20:1-16

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Why are you jealous because I am generous?

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.'
