



CELEBRATING THE YEAR OF ST JOSEPH

8 December 2020 - 8 December 2021

The Holy Father has proclaimed a “Year of Saint Joseph” from 8th December 2020, to 8th December 2021. Pope Francis has called the Church to become more aware of the important role of St Joseph in our Christian faith and to focus our attention on him as the patron of the universal Church.

In his Apostolic Letter *Patris corde* (“With a Father’s Heart”), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved, tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows.

Patris corde marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX’s declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. “Thanks to his role in salvation history, Saint Joseph has always been venerated as a father by the Christian people. This is shown by the countless churches dedicated to him worldwide, the numerous religious Institutes, Confraternities and ecclesial groups inspired by his spirituality and bearing his name, and the many traditional expressions of piety in his honour. Innumerable holy men and women were passionately devoted to him. Among them was Teresa of Avila, who chose him as her advocate and intercessor, had frequent recourse to him and received whatever graces she asked of him. Encouraged by her own experience, Teresa persuaded others to cultivate devotion to Joseph.”¹

Our own Australian Saint, Mary of the Cross MacKillop, together with Fr Julian Tenison Woods, founded the Order of the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart and chose St Joseph to be patron of the Congregation. Mary’s extensive writings and letters to her Sisters encouraged them to “apply to St Joseph in confidence, in every difficulty and you will not be disappointed.” (Mary MacKillop 1906)

We too, can take great heart in St Joseph’s example and emulate his qualities of tenderness, faith, trust and courage described for us the Gospels. Mary MacKillop invites us “to ask Joseph to obtain for us a generous devoted love for Jesus, a love that will make us like himself....a love that, ... will make us delight in serving Him in His poor and His neglected little ones.... And his love of Christ cannot exist in our hearts without enabling us to live in perfect charity and love. (Mary MacKillop 1893)

This prayer service may be used at any time during the Year of St Joseph, but especially for the Solemnity of St Joseph (19th March) and St Joseph the Worker (1st May)

Welcome/Introduction

School's Acknowledgement to Country.

Today, March 19th we celebrate the feast of St Joseph.

Everything we know about St Joseph suggests that he showed many admirable qualities throughout his life.

Qualities such as:

- Humility
- Patience
- Faithfulness
- Obedience
- Loyalty

As the husband of Mary and foster-father of Jesus, Joseph had a very important role. Joseph became a model of faithful service to others by placing Mary and Jesus', needs before his own. He shows us how to look after each other with compassion, care and concern.

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with Child of the Holy Spirit; and her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to send her away quietly. But as he considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit; she will bear a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins. When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took Mary as his wife.

The Gospel of the Lord

Reflection *(to be accompanied with picture that students have drawn or a dramatisation)*

Student 1

Scripture tells us very little about Joseph's life, and there is much we wish we could know what is made clear however, is that Joseph was "a righteous man" and a loving husband and father. Here are some stories from the Bible that tell us about Joseph.

Student 2

St Joseph was a descendent from David, one of the greatest kings of Israel. He lived in Bethlehem but he moved to Nazareth to work as a builder or a carpenter. Saint Joseph was chosen by God to be Jesus' father on earth. God knew that Jesus would need a foster father

to raise him and teach him. In Matthew's Gospel, we hear that Joseph was a 'just man.' This means he was a good, honest, fair, and God-loving person.

Student 3

We know Joseph was man of faith, obedient to whatever God asked of him without knowing the outcome. When an angel came to Joseph in a dream and told him about the child Mary was carrying, Joseph took Mary as his wife and promised to protect the child as he grew up. Joseph trusted God. He married Mary and took her into his home.

Student 4

Joseph then took Mary to Bethlehem for the census. Joseph walked all the way, for many days and he had a donkey for Mary, who was pregnant, to ride on. He also tried his best to find a place for Mary to stay when Jesus was being born. Joseph was showing care and concern for his wife and the baby she was carrying.

Student 5

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem, the angel came again to tell Joseph that his family was in danger. Joseph immediately left everything he owned, all his family and friends. He put his faith into God's hands, and fled to a strange country with his young wife and the baby to escape Herod's soldiers. He waited in Egypt without question until it was safe to go back.

Student 6

When Jesus was young, he went missing for three days and finally Joseph and Mary found him in the Temple, teaching the scribes and elders. Joseph's one concern was for the safety of the child he loved so much and who had been entrusted to him from God. When Jesus stayed in the Temple we are told Joseph (along with Mary) searched and searched for him. Imagine how worried they must have been! Their precious child lost in a crowd. When they found Jesus, they returned home to Nazareth.
