Dear Clergy, Parish and School Communities

In preparation for our Diocesan Assembly om 13-14 September this year, the Diocesan community is being invited to embark on a period of prayer and preparation in the months leading up to the Assembly.

This will take the form of a Diocesan Pilgrimage of the Icon of our Lady of Perpetual Help (the Patroness of our Diocese) and the Diocesan Plenary 2020 Candle. Each parish will host the Icon and Candle for one week with the opportunity to receive and bless the Icon at weekend Masses and have it displayed for prayer during the week. During this time, parishes are encouraged to invite parishioners and also school communities to be involved. With this letter, you will find a resource pack of ritual and prayer that may be used for different circumstances. Please adapt as desired for your community's use.

The Diocesan Pilgrimage will commence at St Mary's Cathedral Sale on the weekend of Sunday 24th February. A timetable for the Pilgrimage throughout the Diocese is attached.

Please note that it is the responsibility of the host parish to contact the parish next on the roster and make arrangements for the Icon, Candle, Easel and materials to be taken to the next parish by Friday at the latest, so that they can be displayed at all weekend Masses.

BULLETIN NOTICE: Diocesan Assembly and Pilgrimage

Bishop Patrick has announced a Diocesan Assembly to be held on 13-14 September at Marist-Sion College Warragul. During the Plenary Council 2020 *Listening and Dialogue* process, several common topics have emerged. It has become evident that many of the suggestions which have been made can be initiated and implemented at a local Diocesan level. The Diocesan Assembly, while part of the overall Plenary journey, is of vital importance as it will provide us with the opportunity to together discern and discuss what it is that we can do here and now for our local Church in the Diocese of Sale.

In the months leading up to the Assembly, the Diocesan community is being invited to embark on a period of prayer and preparation with a Diocesan Pilgrimage of the Icon of our Lady of Perpetual Help (the patroness of our Diocese) and the Diocesan Plenary 2020 Candle. Each parish will host the Icon and Candle for one week with the opportunity to receive and bless the Icon at weekend Masses and have it displayed for prayer during the week.

PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

All parishes are invited to join in a prayer roster by praying for the parish in the diocese who is currently hosting the Icon and Plenary Candle as part of the Diocesan Pilgrimage.

Icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help

The original Byzantine icon dates from the 15th century, and possibly from the 13th. It has been in Rome since 1499 and is now housed in the church of St Alphonsus Liguori and in the care of the Redemptorists.

It shows the Virgin Mary holding the child Jesus, who seems to be a small adult. Jesus clasps the right hand of his mother as he looks upwards where the archangels Michael and Gabriel are holding the instruments of his redeeming passion. St Michael holds the spear, the wine



soaked sponge and the crown of thorns, while St Gabriel holds the cross and nails.

As the Christ child contemplates this vision of his coming passion there is a hint of his anguish shown by the loss of one of his sandals. Yet the icon also depicts the triumph of the resurrection shown by the glorious gold of the background and the angels holding the instruments like trophies.

Mary looks outward; she is both holding her child and presenting him to the faithful viewer. It is worth noting that the figures of Mary and Jesus are both crowned in this copy. The crowns were added in 1867.

Under this title of Perpetual Help, Mary is patroness of several parishes. Significantly for us, Our Lady of Perpetual Help is patroness of the Diocese of Sale. Our first bishop, James Corbett, obtained a copy of the icon when he visited Europe in 1889-90. He returned in February 1890, bringing the icon, along with a group of priests he recruited in Ireland and the first sisters of Our Lady of Sion. The icon is now enshrined in St Mary's Cathedral, Sale.

The copy I have has been in my family for many years. I recall seeing it in the home of my grandparents, Tom and Mary Slater, in Leongatha, and believe it had been with them on their farm at Nerrena beforehand. After they died in the 1960s it moved to my own parents' home and since they died I have kept it.

I could only guess when my grandparents obtained their copy, perhaps when they married in 1917, or possibly at the time of a Redemptorist parish mission in later years.

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Children's Prayer Service: Our Lady of Perpetual Help

Gather the children around the Icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help; provide a vessel with sand for tapers to be placed or a bowl into which petals or flowers are to be placed; tapers or flowers provided or available for each child; response sheet.

Introduction

We gather around this image of Mary, the mother of Jesus, because it is very special for the people of Gippsland. This icon of Mary, the mother of God, is called **Our Lady of Perpetual Help**... and the people of our Diocese look to her for continual help. A beautiful hand painted image, the same as this, hangs in the cathedral in Sale. She is the patroness of the diocese. But this copy we have here with us today is over a hundred years old. It has been loaned to us by Fr Peter Slater, the parish priest of Warragul. It belonged to his grandparents and has had a special place in his family for all these years.



Have a close look at the picture.

Notice how Jesus is safely cradled in his mother's arms. See, also, how he looks anxiously at Gabriel the Archangel, who holds the cross and nails for His Crucifixion. And on his left, Michael the Archangel holds the lance, spear, and the container of vinegar. And look closely at Our Lady's face. See looks very serious and grave... perhaps thinking about her Son's future suffering and death on the cross for us!

Reflection on the Gospel

Spend a few minutes contemplating the short reflection below:

The words of Our Lord to His beloved disciple, "Behold your mother," are an invitation to contemplate Mary. Kneeling reverently before the icon of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Perpetual Help, the words of the Crucified invite us to behold our Mother as she is depicted in her miraculous image. "And from that hour the disciple took her into his home" (Jn 19:27). Wherever the image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help is given a place of honour, Mary herself is welcomed and received there. It has been said that there is scarcely a family in Ireland without an image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. There are similar reports from the Philippines and from Haiti. Her image is also much loved on the sub-continent. When families, parish communities, and individuals welcome an image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help they are, in effect, imitating the Apostle Saint John. The presence of the icon expresses a spiritual desire to abide with Mary and to remain beneath her gaze.
