FIRST READING:

A reading from the prophet Isaiah 58:7-10

Thus says the Lord:

Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your own kin. Then will your light shine like the dawn and your wound be quickly healed over.

Your integrity will go before you and the glory of the Lord behind you. Cry, and the Lord will answer; call, and he will say, 'I am here.'

If you do away with the yoke, the clenched fist, the wicked word, if you give your bread to the hungry, and relief to the oppressed, your light will rise in the darkness, and your shadows become like noon.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 111:4-9. R. v.4

(R.) A light rises in the darkness for the upright.

- He is a light in the darkness for the upright: he is generous, merciful and just. The good man takes pity and lends, he conducts his affairs with honour. (R.)
- The just man will never waver: he will be remembered for ever. He has no fear of evil news; with a firm heart he trusts in the Lord. (R.)
- With a steadfast heart he will not fear; open-handed, he gives to the poor; his justice stands firm for ever. His head will be raised in glory. (R.)

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 2:1-5

When I came to you, brothers, it was not with any show of oratory or philosophy, but simply to tell you what God had guaranteed. During my stay with you, the only knowledge I claimed to have was about Jesus, and only about him as the crucified Christ. Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.



Pope Francis Prayer Intentions for February 2023 For parishes



PLENARY COUNCIL UPDATE: During the second general assembly, more than 35 motions were put to a consultative and a deliberative vote. Those motions that received a qualified majority in the deliberative vote – two-thirds of voters eligible and present – were passed by the Plenary Council. They were confirmed as the decrees of the Plenary Council. The Decrees have been sent to Rome for consideration.

NEW MEMBERSHIP FOR PPC

As the St Brendan's Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) prepares for a renewal of membership, the most important part of this process is PRAYER. We ask everyone to pray that this process results in a membership that continues to foster the spiritual growth of parishioners and lead us all to respond actively.

1. The current PPC are seeking Recommendations for New Council Members. Forms can be found in the church or at the Parish Office.

You DO NOT NEED to ask the person whom

you recommend to accept. It is not a nomination.

- Recommendations close on 28th February Forms can be returned by placing them on the collection plate or handing in at the Parish Office.
- 3. All recommended persons will be invited to attend an Information Meeting (date to be decided). At this meeting we will:
 - Outline the Pastoral Council's Role and Function
 - Include details of expectations and responsibilities of Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) members.
 - Ask participants whether they accept or decline nomination.
- 4. If there are more nominations than vacant positions, the PPC will prayerfully discern all nominations. The aim is to have a council with members who together provide a wide range of charisms and be broadly representative of our baptised community.
