THE GIFT AND PRESENCE OF PROFESSED WOMEN AND MEN RELIGIOUS IN THE DIOCESE OF SALE

The Diocese of Sale is blessed by the service of clergy and religious whose commitment to the mission of the gospel enriches our life in Christ. This is exemplified by their faithful witness across our parishes, in schools and colleges, in service of Catholic Education and the pastoral life of the Diocese. Throughout Church history religious orders have been established by their founders in response to the pastoral and spiritual needs of the Church by bringing both contemplative and apostolic gifts to the service of others.

The presence of consecrated and vowed religious women and men throughout our Diocesan history has been a sign of grace. Under Church Law, the bishop solely approves the presence and missionary activity of religious orders and institutes. It is the law of the Catholic Church that religious superiors or province leaders request permission of a bishop to reside in a diocese and to undertake approved ministries.

Today there are four Religious Orders who enjoy such mutual approval by Bishop Greg: Sisters of Our Lady of the Nativity (Cranbourne), Brigidine Sisters (Catholic Education), Marist Brothers (Diocesan Pastoral Life and Mission Office), and the Oblates of Immaculate Mary (Parish of Moe-Newborough), and other international religious clergy ministering in our parishes. Other clergy or religious visiting or residing in the Diocese must complete necessary safeguarding checks and require the permission of the bishop to undertake public ministry in any form.

The presence of professed and consecrated religious women and men in our Diocese of Sale remains a sign of hope to all of us.

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia..

FIRST READING: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11 Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

(R.) God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

- **1.** All peoples, clap your hands, cry to God with shouts of joy! For the Lord, the Most High, we must fear, great king over all the earth. **(R.)**

May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia!

Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always, until the end of the world.

GOSPEL: Luke 24:46-53

While blessing them, he was taken to heaven.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this. 'And now I am sending down to you what the Father has promised. Stay in the city then, until you are clothed with the power from on high.' Then he took them out as far as the outskirts of Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up to heaven. They worshipped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually in the Temple praising God.



THE STORY OF JACK KELLY

John Francis Kelly was born in 1896 to a mountain cattle family in the remote foothills of the Great Dividing Range at Glenmaggie, in Gippsland. His parents were Patrick and Rosanna Kelly (nee Garvey). He was the ninth child in an Irish family of seventeen children and was known by all as Jack. His schooling was at Gravel Hill State School, across the Macalister River. His catholic faith was handed down to him by his family.

He grew up with horses and cattle and became an excellent stockman. At the start of the First World War, in 1914, he became head stockman at Robert Gilder's Glenfalloch Station in the hills at Licola. While mustering cattle in late 1947 at Holmes Plains he fell from his horse and was badly concussed. After some dramatic coordination between the police, forestry staff, medics and RAAF he was rescued by Neil McInnes who flew a little Tiger Moth airplane with great skill. Jack was flown in an unconscious state, in this crop dusting plane, tied to a hay bale. He was taken to Sale Hospital, where he spent five weeks recovering.

In the early 1950's Jack purchased the freehold property called "The Lower Block" on the left hand branch of the Avon River, between Golden Point and Huggett's Crossing. He brought his cattle down from the High Plains before Winter, each year, to graze on the property. In 1958 he built a hut with assistance from Kevin Higgins and family. Later he retired from this property and moved into a house in Princess St, Maffra. During this time he did some work for the Foster Family at Boisdale, riding his horse to and from work. Jack had never married, and in his old age the Maffra St. Vincent de Paul Society volunteers rendered him a great deal of assistance that enabled him to remain in his house until he died. He appreciated this assistance so much that he bequeathed his estate to the Maffra Conference of St. Vincent de Paul. This money was used to construct the first building that the Maffra Conference owned, and it became the centerpiece of their operation on church land. This building is the "Jack Kelly Shed", and is now joined by eight other sheds that enable the monthly sale to happen. And indeed, this monthly sale is often referred to as the "Jack Kelly Sale".

Jack Kelly passed away on the 25th April, 1983 at the age of 87, and was buried in the Maffra Cemetery. The building named after him continues to stand and be used as the clothing shed. It's a testament to a highly regarded cattleman who showed his appreciation to those who assisted him in his later years.
