Dear Parishioners

The Sunday of the Word of God which we observe this weekend indicates uniqueness of our country. The rest of the world has it in on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time but because in our case it is always during the summer holidays the Holy Sea has given us permission to move it to the first Sunday of February. The move is also an indication of the importance of this Sunday. The Bible says that the faith comes from listening to God's word. Therefore Our Lord Jesus Christ put it in this way: 'Consider carefully how you listen.' A few days ago I was doing some research to prepare myself for the day of St John Bosco, January 31. What I discovered was that as a young boy John was particularly fond of circuses. However he didn't go there for entertainment. He went there to learn some tricks which he could utilise in his interactions with other children. Little John would first amuse children with his tricks and next he would tell them what he heard in the sermon at church. He was creative in finding ways to deliver God's message to his friends. As an Oblate I treasure this special Sunday dedicated to God's word. The Sunday comes between the anniversary of our Oblate Foundation: January 25 and the anniversary of the Approval of the Oblate Congregation by Pope Leo XII on February 17. Our Founder, St Eugene, explained to his companions that the aim of this new establishment was to preach the word of God to the poor. St Eugene believed wholeheartedly that the only way to bring a revival to the Church was by receiving and giving the richness of God's word. 'Consider carefully how you listen.' I entrust these words to you. There is some technicality how we listen at church (a good sound system is important as well as a good hearing aid) and then it is how open we are to hear what God wants to tell us; not what we want to hear from God.

We welcome back Fr Vin McGillicuddy returning from his holiday extravaganza in NSW. It's good to have you back home Fr Vin. At the same time we say Bon Voyage to Fr Vincent Obialor who is heading off for a couple of months to the City of churches to assist in our Oblate Parish of St David's in SA. We wish Fr Vincent a happy time in Adelaide and ask him to pass our best wishes to Fr Josh Nash with whom he will minister there. I keep you in my prayers

<u>Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time.</u> On this Sunday of the Word of God you are invited to do Lectio Divina (Divine Reading), a prayerful way of reading the Bible.

Opening prayer: Lord Jesus, send Your Spirit to help us to read the Scriptures with the same mind that You read them to the disciples on the way to Emmaus. In the light of the Word, written in the Bible, you helped them to discover the presence of God in the disturbing events of Your sentence and death. Thus, the cross that seemed to be the end of all hope became for them the source of life and of resurrection. Create silence in us so that we may listen to Your voice in Creation and in the Scriptures, in events and in people, above all in the poor and suffering. May Your word guide us so that we too, like the two disciples on the way to Emmaus, may experience the force of Your resurrection and witness to others that You are alive in our midst as source of fraternity, justice and peace. We ask this of You, Jesus, son of Mary, who revealed the Father to us and sent us Your Spirit. Amen.

Reading: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew Mt 5:13-16

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men. 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.

Meditation: After the reading, take some time to reflect in silence on one or more of the following questions: What word or words in this passage caught your attention? What in this passage comforted you? What in this passage challenged you? If practicing lectio divina as a family or in a group, after the reflection time, invite the participants to share their responses.

Using images of daily life, with simple and direct words, Jesus makes known what is the mission and the reason for being of the Community: to be salt! In that time, because of the great heat, people and animals needed to eat much salt. The salt was delivered in great blocks by the suppliers and these blocks were placed in the public square to be consumed by the people. The salt which remained fell on the ground, was no longer good for anything and it was stepped on by everyone. Jesus recalls this usage to clarify the mission which the disciples have to carry out. Without salt nobody could live, but what remained of the salt was good for nothing. The comparison is obvious. Nobody lights a candle to place it under a bushel. A city on a mountain top cannot remain hidden. The community must be light, has to illuminate. It must not be afraid to show the good that it does. It does not do it to make it seen, but what it does can and should be seen. Salt does not exist for itself. Light does not exist for itself. This is the way a community should be: it cannot close itself in self.

Prayer

Read the Scripture passage one more time. Bring to the Lord the praise, petition, or thanksgiving that the Word inspires in you.

Contemplation

Read the Scripture again, followed by this reflection:

What conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me?

But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? When have I experienced a dryness in my faith life? How can I take time away to restore and renew my faith?

A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden. When have I tried to hide my beliefs to avoid criticism or mocking? How do I demonstrate my faith through my actions?

Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father. How do my actions point toward God instead of myself? How do I place my God-given gifts in service to my brothers and sisters?

Final Prayer

Lord Jesus, we thank for the word that has enabled us to understand better the will of the Father. May your Spirit enlighten our actions and grant us the strength to practice what your Word has revealed to us. May we, like Mary, Your mother, not only listen to but also practice the Word. You live and reign with the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit forever and ever. Amen.
