From the desk (and the heart) of Fr Daniel omi L. J. C. et M. I.

Dear Parishioners

A few days ago during my class rounds at St Kieran's Parish School I visited a foundation class where the children informed me that they were learning the letter 'G.' They also told me that the letter 'G' is in the word God. When I saw the happy and excited faces of the little boys and girls because they made such a brilliant discovery I thought that I should pray to God so that all of us in the Parish and all the people in our wider community, including those who don't believe in God, could have the same childlike joy and excitement at discovering that everything in our life, not only the 'G' sound, connects us to the God who has created us, saved us and sustains us every day. This Solemnity of the Most Blessed Trinity is an eye opener to the redeeming interactions the Father, Son and Holy Spirit have constantly with us. Take a moment this Sunday and acknowledge a recent moment or moments when you believed God the Father was near you, when God the Son was near you, when God the Holy Spirit was near you.

Last week I also had a joy of attending the Annual Police Award night at Moe RSL. The long list of recipients of various medals and awards was a celebration of the extraordinary involvement of our police officers in the betterment of our local community. I was inspired by the Senior Sargent in charge of the Moe Police Station who was awarded for 25 years of service. Please pray for him and for all members of Police Force, particularly those serving at our local Police station. Our prayers for them are our faith acknowledgment of their contribution.

I must also confess that the news of the passing by the ACT Legislative Assembly of the controversial bill giving the Government power to compulsory acquire the Catholic Hospital in Canberra brought to my mind the painful memory from our Oblate history in Poland. In 1952 the socialist Government compulsory acquired the boarding Catholic high school which was built by the Oblates and where 300 boys were receiving education. The Oblates were allowed to take only their personal items while everything else was confiscated by the Government officials. As soon as they took over the school they turned it into a school for blind children. Every time the Oblates requested to have the property returned to the rightful owners they were given this response: 'You want to have the blind children end up in the street, don't you? You don't care about the unfortunate.' Is history repeating itself? Let us pray that the injustice that has been inflicted on the Calvary Health Care and the Catholic Church can be transformed by our merciful God into a moment of grace for the Faith to grow.

I keep you in my prayers.

A big **Thank You** from the Oblate fathers for your generous offerings through our Easter envelopes.


Another big Thanks
