Dear Parishioners

On Friday we remembered St Andrew Düng-Lac and his 118 companions, Vietnamese Martyrs. Among them were 96 Vietnamese Catholics, 11 Spanish missionaries and 10 French missionaries. When I was reading their stories, I was moved by the life and ministry witness of St. Valentin Faustino Berri Ochoa. St Valentin was a Spanish Dominican priest. He came from a poor family but was determined to become a priest. He achieved that despite finding studying difficult. In March 1858 he arrived in Vietnam where he was welcomed by Bp Joseph Suarez. The bishop was aware that he himself could be soon arrested and killed. Despite the danger he didn't want to leave Vietnam. He wanted to continue caring for Catholics there. The only fear the bishop had was that if he were killed the people of his diocese wouldn't have a bishop. That's why three months later Bishop Suarez asked Fr Valentin to become a bishop. On the night of 13th June 1858 Fr Valentin was ordained bishop during a quiet celebration. His bishop mitre (bishop's hat) was made of paper. His crosier (bishop's staff) was made of a bamboo stick wrapped in straw and yellow paper. He was 31 at the time. Bishop Suarez was right in predicting his arrest and death. It happened a month later. He died at the age of 40. His successor, bishop Valentin, ministered for three more years. He was arrested on 25th of October 1861 and was beheaded on 1st of November. Together with him bp Jerome Hermosilla and Fr Peter Almato were also martyred . Bp Valentin was 34 when he was killed. All of them are now venerated as Saints of the Catholic Church.

This Sunday as we adore Jesus Christ, Universal King, I wanted to share with you this glimpse into these Saints. They lived at a time when it looked as though Christ's reign meant nothing. Christians were persecuted. Still Jesus Christ reigned in his followers who chose being faithful to him despite threats and danger of death. These 118 Vietnamese Martyrs are only a small group selected out of 300,000 Catholics who were killed in 18th and 19th Century Vietnam. Their blood, like the blood of martyrs before them, wasn't wasted. It 'watered' Vietnam where the Catholic Church is flourishing in a wonderful way.

This Sunday night Fr Vincent and I will attend a Mass at St John Vianney Church in Springvale North. During the Mass an Oblate Seminarian Br Benjamin will take his perpetual vows as a Missionary Oblate of Mary Immaculate. You may remember Br Ben from last Easter when he sang beautifully the Exultet at the Easter Vigil at St Mary's. Please say a prayer or two for Br Benjamin so that the Oblate Crucifix he will receive on Sunday will strengthen him to be a holy and courageous missionary.

Thank you to the parishioners who came along to the Blessing and Opening of the new learning facilities at St Kieran's School. Please keep both our Parish Schools in your prayers. There are many non-Catholics there. It means that our schools are our mission territories. What an opportunity for us as a faith community to evangelise. We don't need to go to faraway places to evangelise. We can do it here in the Valley. Well done to all students and staff of St Kieran's for organising such a wonderful celebration on Wednesday. We are proud of you.

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel Ez 34:11-12. 15-17

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest – it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them.

As for you, my sheep, the Lord says this: I will judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and he-goats. *The word of the Lord.*

After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all. The word of the Lord.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew. Matthew 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine. you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'
