4th Sunday of Easter Year C. Weekday cycle 1

> Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost who has taken the name Leo XIV

His first words, in Italian, to the crowds in St Peter's Square was

"Peace be with all of you". Robert Prevost was born in Chicago, USA, on September 14, 1955. He has French, Italian and African-Haitian ancestry.

He has many academic qualifications including a Doctorate of Canon Law. In 1982 he was ordained a priest in the Augustinian Order, and continued his studies while teaching secondary school physics and maths. He speaks many languages fluently, and is

the first Pope in history to be a native English speaker. He spent years as a missionary in Peru, teaching Canon Law in the Augustinian seminary, as a judge in the regional ecclesiastical court, and leading a local Parish. In 1999, he became provincial of the Augustinian Province of Chicago, and in 2001 was elected Prior General of the Augustinians, serving two terms. On September 26, 2015, he was named bishop of Chiclayo, Peru and became a naturalized Peruvian citizen before becoming bishop. In 2023, Pope Francis appointed him prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops with the title archbishop-bishop emeritus of Chiclayo, and later that year he was created a cardinal-deacon. As part of his role as prefect he evaluated and recommended episcopal candidates worldwide. In February this year Pope Francis promoted him to cardinal-bishop.

Archbishop Anthony Fisher of Sydney says we can expect our new Pope to be a man with a missionary heart, and a great teacher. He describes him as being a man of peace, a unifier who will help reconcile people and factions, dedicated to simplicity of life and to community life. He expects we will see the new Pope in Australia soon, as Australia hosts the International Eucharistic Congress in 2028.

Please keep Pope Leo in your prayers as he takes up the challenging leadership of our church.

Ministry to the sick and the aged

We are inviting parishioners to volunteer for ministry in a nursing home. Duties Involve setting up a prayer space for the Mass when it is celebrated there or leading a Communion service in the absence of a priest. You may also need to visit residents in their rooms to distribute Holy Communion to those who are unable to attend a service. Volunteers need to have a valid Working with Children Card as well as Police Clearance to volunteer in a nursing home.

Booking Mass intentions

Please remember that <u>one priest</u> may only offer <u>one Mass</u> <u>intention per Mass</u> (a Mass intention means an intention booked by one person, it can include a number of people for whom the Mass is offered). If there are two priests at Mass two intentions may only be offered.

Please note also that the priests are obliged to say one Mass on weekends *for the people*. It refers to the requirement of all ordained pastors to say Mass for the people entrusted to them. Therefore **please ensure you leave one Mass for this intention free for this purpose if you are booking a Sunday Mass and there is only one priest in the Parish.**



A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said:

I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

Good Shepherd Sunday. 4th Sunday of Easter

A reading from the book of the Apocalypse Revelation 7:9, 14-17

I, John, saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. One of the elders said to me, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and because they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb, they now stand in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary; and the One who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. They will never hunger or thirst again; neither the sun nor scorching wind will ever plague them, because the Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water; and God will wipe away all tears from their eyes.'
