Crosses, Crosses!

Crosses, crosses everywhere – on churches/ hospitals/ on many flags (including our own), worn as jewellery by believers and plenty of non- believers as well. It is the overarching symbol of our faith; omnipresent - just there! Sadly, most people, even Christians, rarely pause to reflect on our symbol.

That is why this feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is so important, reminding Kelly us to pause and reflect on the enormity behind the symbol. The feast occurs on September 14th every year, but in 2025 the feast falls on a Sunday. It is of such importance that it trumps the regular ordinary time readings, and all the other mainstream Christian churches celebrate it too. Since 335 AD, this ancient feast has reached to the core of our Christianity, as a special day of venerating the Cross.

The reading from Numbers (Num 21:4-9) references Moses saving from death those bitten by a serpent. Jesus, well versed in his scriptures, uses this simile (John 3:13-17) to illustrate God's love for the world for which his Son is lifted up (on the Cross) to save believers. We are reassured by John 3:17 that God's plan is to save all the world.

At times we have sanitised the Cross, as too brutal to contemplate, but in the Catholic Church we prefer crucifixes (that is crosses with a representation of the body attached). Because, without the stark brutality, we may fail to engage with the reality of the Son's sacrifice for all of

Jesus was fully human and yet fully divine. Preaching and teaching the Good

News of God's absolute, infinite love for us all, he made choices which inexorably led to his crucifixion and death. Fully aware of this, he was humiliated, suffered, and died for each of us on that cross and, gloriously, he rose from death on the third day. The crucifix represents the crucifixion of Jesus Christ and the subsequent triumph and salvation He offers to all. Let us reflect on the Creator who loves us so much. Deacon Mark

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading Numbers 21:4-9

A reading from the book of Numbers

When those that were afflicted looked upon it, they were healed.

On the way through the wilderness, the Israelites lost patience. They spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt to die in this wilderness? For there is neither bread nor water here; we are sick of this unsatisfying food.'

At this God sent fiery serpents among the people; their bite brought death to many in Israel. The people came and said to Moses, 'We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you. Intercede for us with the Lord to save us from these serpents.' Moses interceded for the people, and the Lord answered him, 'Make a fiery serpent and put it on a standard. If anyone is bitten and looks at it, he shall live.' So Moses fashioned a bronze serpent which he put on a standard, and if anyone was bitten by a serpent, he looked at the bronze serpent and lived.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 77:1-2. 34-38. R. v.7

(R.) Do not forget the works of the Lord!

- Give heed, my people, to my teaching; turn your ear to the words of my mouth.
 I will open my mouth in a parable and reveal hidden lessons of the past. (R.)
- 2. When he slew them then they would seek him, return and seek him in earnest.

 They would remember that God was their rock, God the Most High their redeemer. (R.)
- 3. But the words they spoke were mere flattery; they lied to him with their lips. For their hearts were not truly with him; they were not faithful to his covenant. (R.)
- Yet he who is full of compassion forgave their sin and spared them.
 So often he held back his anger when he might have stirred up his rage. (R.)

Second Reading Philippians 2:6-11

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians

He humbled himself, therefore God had exalted him.

The state of Jesus was divine, yet he did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave,

and became as men are;

and being as all men are,

he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross.

But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names

so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus

and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
